# Reading Book Notes For Kids

Wide Rule

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Thin Rule



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- Choose between wide-ruled or thin-ruled lines. Then print the pages. There are two pages of each option, so they can be printed easily on the front and back of one piece of paper.
- Store the pages in a binder or folder. (There are also reading journals available that have the same information for a total of 100 books, in addition to a few additional pages. See the last page of this PDF for additional information about those.)
- Students can record the title, author, number of pages, the date started, and the date ended for each book they read. They can also write the book number in the book cloud. For example, they would write the number one for their first book and the number two for their second book and continue from there.
- Students can also mark the book as Fiction or Nonfiction and color in the stars to give the book a rating.
  - O Stars I wish I hadn't read it.
  - 1 Star It was terrible.
  - 2 Stars It wasn't that good.
  - 0 3 Stars It was okay.
  - 0 4 Stars It was good.
  - 0 5 Stars It was amazing!
- · Students can then write their thoughts on the remaining lines.
